

ORGANISING YOUR QUIZ

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Step 1 - Date & location

We are celebrating National Care Leavers' Week from October 24th-31st, but you can host your quiz at any time. Host at home, at work or ask your local pub or a community space.

Step 2 - Invite your friends

Host with as few as 3 friends taking part individually, or more than 30 friends in teams. Get it in your friends' diaries early. Think about setting up a Facebook event.

Step 3 - Print out the questions

Print out and use the questions in this pack. Or why not write your own rounds? Make sure you have enough paper and pens for teams' answers.

Step 4 - Find a winner's prize

Print off the winner's certificate in this pack. Or why not ask a local business to donate a prize such as a gift voucher or a box of sweet treats?

Step 5 - Ask for an entry donation

Ask each participant for an entry donation of their choice. Or set a suggested donation such as £15. See the next page for how you can collect and transfer donations.

Step 6 - Have fun!

Bring your friends together, enjoy a quiz and do good raising funds and awareness of what it means to be a child in care or care leaver.



Kinship care is when a child lives full-time or most of the time with a relative or friend who isn't their parent, usually because their parents aren't able to care for them. Peter Parker (Spiderman) was raised by his Aunt and Uncle.

44% of children's homes in England have 3-4 beds (931). The second most common is 5-6 beds with 28% (585).

Foster care began in 1853 when Reverend John Armistead removed children from a workhouse in Cheshire and placed them with foster families. The local council (called unions at the time) was legally responsible for the children and paid the foster parents a sum equal to the cost of maintaining the child in the workhouse.

In the event of a draw, ask a tie-breaker question and the closest answer is the winner.

Tie-break question - What is the course record for the Men's Oxford and Cambridge annual boat race?

Answer: 16 minutes 19 seconds (set by Cambridge in 1998)




